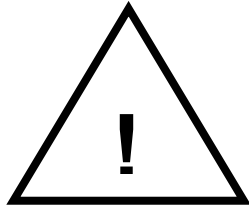

Detailed information related to “EMC Regulatory Requirements ” that apply in your country when an Applicant seeks a Certification Mark from the relevant NCBs located in your country: ITALY

Unless when included in the applicable product standard, the IMQ procedures for granting its certification marks do not require compliance with the EMC requirements. It is however required that the product is in compliance with all applicable Regulatory requirements, in particular the requirements of European Directives (as endorsed by the national Law or Decree).

NOTE: Evidence of CE Marking is considered appropriate evidence of conformity.

As regards EMC in Italy (and in European Union), all electrical products under IECEE - CB Scheme shall comply with the “EMC Regulatory Requirements” based on 89/336/EEC Council Directive of 3 May 1989 *on the approximation of the laws of the Member States relating to electromagnetic compatibility*

(endorsed in Italy with Decree D.Lgs. 12-11-1996, No. 615)

NOTE: Directive 89/336/EEC will be replaced from 20 July 2007 by Directive 2004/108/EC. Member States shall not however impede the placing on the market and/or the putting into service of equipment which are in compliance with the provisions of Directive 89/336/EEC and which were placed on the market before 20 July 2009 (transitional period).

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Some other electrical products, covered by IECEE-CB Scheme, shall comply with other specific EU directives:

- **products (e.g. CAT OFF) having radio/telecommunication functions are covered by Directive 1999/5/EC of 9 March 1999 on Radio equipment and Telecommunications Terminal Equipment and the mutual recognition of their conformity that refers to the a.m. 89/336/EEC Directive**
(endorsed in Italy with Decree D.Lgs. 09-05-2001, No. 269)

- **medical electrical equipment (e.g. CAT MED) are covered by Directive 93/42/EEC of 14 June 1993 concerning medical devices that contains specific EMC Requirements in its Essential Requirements.**
(endorsed in Italy with Decree D.Lgs. 24-02-1997, No. 46)

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Compliance with specific Harmonized Standards is considered a presumption of conformity with the essential requirements for EMC aspects.
